### **Children in Need**

Thank you to everyone who contributed to the success of our Children in Need Day. We raised a grand total of £373.15. The children enjoyed placing their pocket money on our life size Pudsey Bear picture (thanks must go to our talented artist, Matilda Arnold in Year 5), as well as buying a variety of home-baked cakes (thank you to everyone who provided cakes for us to sell). Thanks must also go to Maria Speirs for providing us with a wonderful cake to raffle; the lucky winner was Amelia Ambridge in Year 5 and I hear the whole family thought it was delicious.

### **Forest Day**

Forest day was a huge success and enjoyed by children, staff and our volunteer parents. The children got to experience using a variety of different tools, such as saws and potato peelers (who'd have thought) whilst creating different types of forest crafts, some of which will be on sale at the Christmas Fayre on Friday. Thank you to all our parent helpers who contributed to the success of the day and also to our parents who very kindly sourced and delivered the wood and sticks for us.

### **Grounds Day**

Luckily the weather was on our side and we managed to tidy up the Early Years outside space, the main playground and the woodland area to ensure it was safe and ready for the children to enjoy their forest school experiences. ### **Winchester Science Centre – Planetarium Visit**

Hopefully, you will have all read our letter regarding the planetarium visit on Tuesday. We were all extremely disappointed that the event was unable to go ahead, we attempted to problem solve the situation in a number of ways but unfortunately it wasn't to be. We have been in contact with the Winchester Science Centre and they have quite rightly offered a full refund. All those parents who contributed towards the cost of the planetarium visit will of course receive a full refund in due course. As well as this they have also offered us, as a
