PE and Sports Funding Action Plan 16-17

Key Question 1: How much funding will Burley Primary School receive in 2016-17 (April-March)?

Answer: £8,000 plus an extra £5 per pupil (years 1-6) at Burley this is around £8,500 a year.

feedback from parents, other schools, other professionals and volunteers

The PE co-ordinator will be responsible for reporting progress/outcomes and impact to the HT/GB. The GB will scrutinise impact and an annual update will be available to stakeholders (published on the school website).

Key question 3: How will we sustain this provision into the future?

We believe that the factors below will help us to sustain our provision going forward:

- We have aimed to strengthen a culture of engagement - PE and sport are valued and fundamental aspects of our provision.
- As a small school sustainability is an important part of our thinking in all areas. Small numbers of children wanting to participate in extra-curricular provision mean that we work with our parents and form good partnerships with providers to make these activities viable (e.g. helping with promotion, newsletters, organising trial sessions etc.)
- We have developed resources, expertise, links for fixtures and support from parents/volunteers.
